- Develop, maintain and ensure compliance with Quality Management System (QMS) including adherence to Quality Procedures (QP), Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and Work Instructions (WIs).
- Deliver continuous improvement of the CCTV department and frontline digital forensic performance including the completion and corrective action from internal and external audits and feedback, problem solving, investigation of anomalies including root cause analysis for findings and trend analysis.
- Evaluate the risk of non-conformance and rectify the non-conformance to ensure continued delivery of technical operations.
- Coordinate the departments participation in Inter-Lab Comparisons (ILC) and Proficiency Testing (PT), prepare ILC material as required and review, report and investigate the results of the departments submissions as appropriate.
- Assist with the competence testing of all CCTV Forensic Imaging Staff
