

ROLE PROFILE

Purpose of the Role

To conduct proactive and reactive investigations into complex and serious crimes ensuring that the best possible evidence is secured and that cases are fully and efficiently investigated to detect the crime(s) and allow a considered decision to be taken about the prosecution of offenders.

Main Duties

- To conduct thorough investigations to secure the best evidence available, using effective management and all available resources, working to an agreed case investigation plan, in order to detect crime and allow a considered decision to be taken regarding the prosecution of offenders, and make a clear recommendation as to the appropriate disposal option in cases where all useful lines of enquiry have been explored.
- To submit complete and accurate case papers compiled to the highest professional standard, within set time limits and to ensure evidential integrity
- To act as a liaison officer for victims and witnesses of crimes being investigated, ensuring that they are made aware of the process of their investigation and prosecution if appropriate, providing support and reassurance during the prosecution process.
- To arrest offenders, conduct searches and collate and report any information
 of intelligence value gained during the course of investigations and the
 potential for recruiting informants or exploring other fruitful sources of
 information.
- To maintain awareness in current trends and intelligence relating to offences and offenders who feature as the Force and Area objectives and priorities.
- To maintain liaison with internal and external agencies in order to ensure the greatest assistance is available for identifying crime and tracing offenders, ensuring that all aspects of investigation are taken into account.
- To liaise with the prosecuting authorities ensuring actions/requests are dealt with timorously.
- To maintain liaison with uniform colleagues, assisting in any areas of crime, file preparation and possible suspects of crime.
